- visit to Mole National park

Day 6 Travel back to Accra

 visit to Cocoa Farm (private Farm): A sufficient explanation has been given (from cocoa tree planting to cocoa production). Cocoa Farms have been included in Ghana REDD+ as important platform.

Expectation:

- we Expected to benefit from the experiences of Ghana REDD+ and raise in REDD+ topics and implementation of REDD+ action plan to help us in our strategy development.
- what we found and gained was beyond our expectation except in Safeguard and land tenure topic which we need more training in this topic.
